Build capacities

In all countries, we develop trainings and certificate courses for representatives of various state institutions and civil society organizations, in order to strengthen migration management and meet the needs of the most vulnerable migrants, especially unaccompanied children and adolescents, in various contexts, including crisis situations.

In-person Trainings:

Cross protection-oriented trainings a workshops include:

- Specialized Course on Child and Adolescent Migrants
- Workshop on psychosocial assistance for migrants and migrant shelters/centers
- Course on youth and migration
- Course on lesbian, gay, trans, bisexual or intersex (LGTBI) migrants
- Trafficking in persons: prevention, protection and persecution, including in crisis situations
- Workshops to address migration in the context of emergency protocols

Online Trainings:

Informative courses and other more specialized courses are accessible ters to government representatives, civil society, students, academics, and the or general public, on topics such as international law, human trafficking, migrant women, and assistance to migrant victims of human rights violations.

We promote the prevention of risks associated with irregular migration



We implement a community-based communication strategy to help prevent the risks of irregular migration, with a focus on children and adolescents, through the diffusion of messages vis-a-vis social networks and within communities about risks, rights and protection of migrants. We work in alliance with art collectives in disseminating messages of prevention.

We promote the opening of Specialized Information Hubs for migrants at strategic border points.

Migration management in emergency contexts



We implement a pilot Mobile Application for Migrants (Migrant App) proposed as a tool for safe and informed migration.



We promote regional coordination and bilateral, national and local dialogues

We support cross-border meetings to strengthen migration management and bilateral coordination at strategic borders.

We create spaces to facilitate communication between the central and local levels, and between authorities and civil society.



We propose guidelines and regional meetings focused on the exchange of best practices within the framework of the Regional Conference on Migration (CRM):

- Regional Action Guidelines for Comprehensive Protection of Children and Adolescents in the Context of Migration
- Workshop on policies regarding the Reintegration of Migrants
- Workshop to build the capacity of consular officers to protect their own nationals affected by crises abroad

We promote the creation of response units for unaccompanied child migrants at key transit points.

Direct Assistance and Voluntary Return



We lend direct assistance to migrants in vulnerable situations, referred by State and non-state actors. Unaccompanied minors, victims of trafficking, kidnapping or sexual violence, the elderly, migrants with health problems, among others, benefit from our assistance, whether during transit, voluntary return, or at destination points.

We support shelters that assist unaccompanied minors in the Northern Triangle and Southern Mexico.
