InformArte en Movimient is the awareness-raising community strategy through which messages regarding key concepts, regular migration tips, prevention of the risks related to irregular migration are disseminated, especially to youth.

 Development of tools for schools and community organizations for the prevention of irregular migration in a sustainable way, including more than 1,000 girls and boys at risk.



 Information hubs that are mobile and close to border communities in order to implement coordinated and permanent prevention actions, and to inform about the alternatives to irregular migration in the municipalities and among community leaders.





 MigrantApp is the first IOM application for the protection of migrants in Mesoamerica. It compiles in a single access point true, useful and trustworthy information about 1,500 centers that offer protection and assistance, sending

remittances, emergency alerts, and more. It is available for free at the Google Play and IOS stores. Goal: 4,000 downloads





Improve the capacity of state and civil society to provide
direct assistance and voluntary return to vulnerable migrants:

- Promotion of standardized procedures and best practices to assist vulnerable migrants, including voluntary return.
- IOM Direct assistance to the most vulnerable.
- Strengthening of the capacities of shelters and institutional networks for the support of local communities.

Foster regional, bilateral, national and local dialogue and cooperation:

- In the framework of the Regional Conference on Migration (RCM): Foster dialogue about regular channels of labor migration and support a Plan of Action to fight migrant smuggling.
- REGIONAL:

- BILATERAL: Cross-border meetings to develop border inter-institutional networks.
- NACIONAL/ LOCAL: Improve the communication between central and local levels.
